Individuals may make voluntary contributions to AAGP-PAC using personal checks, made payable to AAGP-PAC, or with an individual Visa, MasterCard, or American Express credit card. Contributions from corporations and associations are illegal and will be returned. Under federal law, only U.S. citizens or permanent resident aliens (green card holders residing in the U.S.) may contribute to, or be solicited for, a political action committee or a political campaign. Gifts to political action committees are not tax deductible.
